The Jackson Hole Airport helped support the Womentum summit for women in leadership that took place last month in Jackson, and employees along with Mary Scott from the board attended this event.

Airport Board and staff had a strong presence at the Town Hall meeting that took place last week in the Teton Library auditorium, where members of the public voiced their concerns about the possibility of a new helicopter tour provider based at the airport. Recycling Update



Soon you will see a new recycling container near the screening area, looking like the image above. There will be an ability to recycle more types of items and the sign graphics will match those used in the national parks. The new container will be 13-feet wide and if it is well received, additional units will be purchased for other locations at the airport.

New ATMs

We now have two ATM machines at the airport. One remains near the vending machines in the baggage claim area, and a new unit is near the American gates in the holding area. The provider has changed from Wells Fargo to First Interstate, so if First Interstate is your bank, no ATM bank fees!

PreCheck is Always Available

Previously, during off-peak times the PreCheck line was closed to travelers, and PreCheck passengers needed to go through the standard screening line. Due to a new flexibility within the screening checkpoint, PreCheck passengers will be integrated into the standard lane when a dedicated PreCheck lane is not open, but they will be able to still experience the benefits of PreCheck (e.g. not needing to remove their shoes). Great job to the screening crew in making this happen so PreCheck will always be available to outbound travelers.


Bravo!

As we continue our series on getting to know the leadership team at the airport, this month we're focusing on Aimee, our Assistant Airport Director–Security Operations.

Many of us who live in Jackson chose to move here from other places in the country, but Aimee is a true native and 5th generation resident. She comes from a family that includes a brother and 2 step-sisters, and her great-great-great grandfather rode with Butch Cassidy. At home today in addition to husband Mike, she has two sons: Brandon age 13,

and Cameron who is 7. You'll also find a black lab named Belle who gets along with the 2 cats in residence.

Aimee has been an airport employee since 1994. She spent time as a Screener for six years while she was attending the University of Wyoming, where she graduated with a degree in Criminal Justice. In the aftermath of September 2001 airport security dramatically changed, and Aimee first became a Screening Supervisor, followed by managing the screening contract we have with the federal government, and then moved to the Assistant Airport Director—Security Operations position she holds today. Aimee also met her husband while working at the airport. He is a former Screener who is now a Deputy Sherriff with the county.

Her responsibilities at the airport place an emphasis on two principal areas: managing general security issues such as access control, badging, and overseeing the Airport Security Coordinator role; and making sure we are in compliance with our TSA security screening contract. She enjoys the team environment at the airport along with the creative challenge of finding the best ways to implement federal regulations in the real world; as JAC is the only airport in the country with screening personnel who are direct employees of an airport. (The majority of screeners work for the federal government, and some are managed by third-party companies.)

Looking toward the future, Aimee is concentrating on getting the screening team fully staffed, and on a personal level would love to travel to Scotland. She has a great "No Regrets" philosophy toward life and focuses on making the most of any opportunity. Whether it's waterskiing in front of Mount Moran or traveling and

camping at national parks throughout the country, Aimee's greatest joy is sharing life experiences with her family. When she isn't exploring nature, you'll find her enjoying a good book, especially crime novels. Her color of choice is purple, and her favorite number is 11. As far as food goes, chocolate is the key to her heart but keep her away from leafy green things!
