
GTNP Report



July 2021 was the busiest month in the history of Grand Teton National Park, with a 9.7% increase over 2020 and a 6.8% increase over 2019. This came with an increase in challenges such as parking, road safety, and emergency medical services for the Park. There was also a 15% increase in backcountry camping and a 21% increase in trail usage.

As of October 2021, the Park has already seen a record number of annual visitations, with the total number expected to hit 4 million by the end of the

year.



The chart above relates the airport's enplanements to GTNP and Yellowstone visitations for the months of June, July and August. The airport's enplanements account for roughly 10% or less of Park visitations. August had the highest percentages at 10.6% of GTNP's visitation, and 8% of Yellowstone's.

Airport Receives the Jay Hollingsworth Speas Award



The airport was honored to be the recipient of the 2021 Jay Hollingsworth Speas Award at the National Airport's Conference in Savannah, Georgia. This award is given annually to the person or persons judged to have contributed most significantly in recent years to the enhancement of relationships between airports and/or heliports and other surrounding environments via exemplary innovation that might be replicated elsewhere.

The Jackson Hole Airport Board and staff have worked diligently to implement numerous initiatives and programs to protect the natural environment, support passengers, staff, and the local community, and to employ resiliency in every aspect of their work. Capital Plan Update

As we near the end of 2021, the airport has successfully completed the ticket counter expansion, the new entry vestibule, and the new marketplace projects. The former administration offices have also been remodeled to accommodate airline partners and the administrative team has moved into their new modular offices located adjacent to the short-term parking lot.

Phase 1 of the runway project has wrapped up for the winter, but everyone's hard work this summer helped us to be prepped and ready for the closure next year.

During Phase 1 we successfully repaved the south end Runway Safety Area and installed nearly **2,000 feet** of slot drain and **4,000 feet** of storm drain, making us one of the only airports in the nation with this type of system. Construction crews screened and crushed over 20,000 cubic yards of subbase course onsite using native material excavated onsite, which kept

approximately 1,300 - 2,000 trucks off the road and saved approximately 28,000 - 45,000 gallons of fuel for hauling activities.

The security screening project is scheduled to kick off mid-January and be completed by the end of June 2022. Updates to the hold room are estimated to be completed by early 2023. The restaurant and gate area projects will begin in early 2022 and are scheduled for completion by the end of next year.

GBAC Star Facility

The process took many months and several hundred hours to complete, and the airport has earned the Global Biorisk Advisory Council Star Facility status. The project was a complete team effort where staff created, organized, and implemented the 20 required GBAC requirements. The Operations staff is proud of this accomplishment and can assure the public that the airport is safe, clean, and comfortable. There are less than 50 airports nationwide that have reached this status.



Employee Recognition



Congratulations to Michelle Anderson, Assistant Airport Director - Finance and Administration, who recently completed her program to earn the Accredited Airport Executive (A.A.E.) designation. Michelle already held a Master's degree, and was able to complete the rigorous final phases to earn this title. She joins a group of less than 500 airport executives nationwide with this designation. JHAB recognizes Phyl Koch for 14 years of service to the airport. She originally started in administration and went on to become the first ever female firefighter at the airport. New Referral Bonus Benefit

As the Jackson Hole Airport Board ("JHAB") works toward becoming an Employer of Choice, we want to encourage employees to refer any qualified and capable candidates you may know for open positions. In order to incentivize employees to make such referrals, JHAB is implementing an Employee Referral Bonus program.

Any Referring Employee who refers a candidate who is hired into an open full-time or part-time position will receive a bonus of \$5,000 after the Referred Employee has successfully completed 6 months of employment with JHAB (based on hire date); and provided that the Referring Employee is still employed by JHAB at that time.
