A Change in the Air



A new service provider will be selected by Delta and United and we hope that many of SkyWest's current ticketing and ground agents will remain at the airport


Pardon Our Dust

Jedediah's



Jedediah's restaurant is being modified to enhance the customer experience. Changes will include improved seating options, defined grab 'n go areas, and new payment areas that will reduce lines and wait times. Additionally, outside the restaurant there will be a new nursing room and separate pet relief area. The restaurant will stay open during construction which will begin this month and the first phase of the project is targeted to wrap up in July. (Construction will only take place at night.) The restaurant remodel is a multi-year project and we will continue to keep staff updated as the project evolves.

Parking Lot



Construction work on the parking lot redesign is at a full court press to make sure everything is completed before the summer crunch is upon us. Keep an eye out for detour signs and please drive slowly through the construction areas. The month of April will focus on finishing the underground road work in the southern parking area where employees will eventually park (orange area in the diagram). Construction will then move to the eastern boundary of the parking lot, north of the main entrance. When this work is finished we should no longer have any

stormwater issues in the lot and this water will be filtered before it leaves the airport property.

Spring Thaw



Depending on how fast the snow melts, it will soon be time for our annual employee Spring roundup in the parking lot and surrounding areas. All employees helping collect items that have been hidden under the snow during the past few months will receive a great lunch at the Firehouse.
