GTNP Report



Over the next ten years, Grand Teton National Park will see at least 40 million visitors based on the four million visitors figure in 2021. Community stakeholders are asking what that might mean for this area and its resources. There is a lot of work to be done, including having important and difficult conversations, and banding together around organizational efforts to further understand this challenge and shape a positive future.

One of the notable community-led efforts taking place is a sustainable destination marketing plan. The Park Service supports this concept and encourages the Airport and its stakeholders to as well.

The Park recognizes the growing impact from air tours near the Park. There is a strong history of collaboration between the Park and the Airport around gathering data and information, and trying to fully understand issues, potential outcomes, and how to mitigate impacts on the Park.



Alex Clark Awarded Outstanding Fireground Performer




In February, the Outstanding Performers in the Firefighter 1 Class of 2021 honored the Airport's Alex Clark as the Outstanding Fireground Performer.

Capital Plan Update



The TSA checkpoint remodel is well underway and on schedule. The above picture was taken recently and shows the new beams that were installed. These beams will raise the checkpoint ceilings and will allow for modern security screening equipment as it becomes available. The checkpoint project is expected to be completed by June 27th.

April 11th is right around the corner and will kick off phase two of the runway reconstruction project, and both the restaurant and gate projects.

The last time the runway was fully reconstructed was in the 1970s. The asphalt runway has been rehabbed four times since it was originally constructed in the late 1970s and it is due for total reconstruction. Construction partners and JAC are committed to guaranteeing that this project is completed efficiently, with minimal impacts, and that it adheres to the highest environmental standards we can achieve on such a project. The project is expected to be completed by June 27th.

The restaurant area project will allow for additional space and updated seating and service areas. A full basement will be constructed under the new restaurant to allow for additional storage. The new design has taken into consideration the flow of foot traffic, ease of access, and efficiency. This project is expected to be completed by early December 2022. Interim food and beverage options will be available in a limited capacity, post-security, throughout the duration of this project.

The gate area adjacent to the restaurant will also be refurbished, adding additional boarding gates. Common use technology will be installed at the gates to allow for flexibility with space and airline operations. The pet relief area and mothers' room will be relocated and will remain in-service throughout the duration of the construction of the new restaurant and gate area.



Annual Spring Clean Up & Beautification

From Monday, April 4th through Wednesday, April 6th, the Airport will be hosting its Annual Spring Clean Up & Beautification. If you fill up a bag with refuse or garbage, you will receive a gift card for lunch at a local establishment.

Upon arrival, sign-in and pick up necessary supplies and equipment in front of the Firehouse. If you would like some guidance on areas to clean-up please work with your employers or operations as they have been briefed on some requested areas of focus.



Active Shooter Training

On April 18th and 19th a lot of the LEOs and Fire/EMS will be conducting EVO (Emergency Vehicle Operations) and active shooter training from 12:00 – 20:00. Please remain clear of the north basement during this time unless you are actively involved with the training

There will be an active shooter training closer to the Airport's reopen where additional staff can be involved, but not this instance.




Employee Recognition

Closure Projects and Shirts

Security Screening and Host Staff

During the Airport closure starting Monday, April 11th, staff participating in projects should plan to arrive at 7:30 am each morning ready to work. Upon arrival, please go to Hanger 1 to learn about the day's plan. Tasks may include manual labor and being outside, so please dress accordingly. If there is inclement weather, projects will likely take place indoors that day.

Any protective equipment or tools needed to complete tasks will be provided by the Airport. Some projects could include painting, working on our new parking lot fence, working on the sterile area seating, organizing spaces or just generally cleaning up the facility.

The Airport is planning on providing a short sleeve tshirt, a long sleeve tshirt, and a lightweight button-up shirt that you can wear while you're here working on projects. These are not required on the days you're working. The Airport may try to coordinate days where everyone wears matching shirts and will communicate accordingly.
