### AIRPORT BOARD HAS NO POWER TO CONTROL OPERATION OF AIRCRAFT

- The FAA has exclusive jurisdiction over the regulation of airspace, including the design of flight procedures.
- FAA air traffic controllers and pilots make individual decisions about where/how aircraft fly.
- Airport cannot
  - Tell aircraft where and how to fly
- Airport can
  - Suggest voluntary procedures



### AIRPORT BOARD HAS LIMITED POWER TO REGULATE USE OF JAC

- Some airports have longstanding limits on use, like mandatory curfews
- In 1990, Congress essentially prohibited all new mandatory noise and access restrictions
- JAC has some pre-1990 use restrictions that come from the 1983 Use Agreement
  - The Airport cannot adopt new restrictions without FAA approval
  - The FAA has not granted such approval for any airport and would not grant approval for JAC



### THERE ARE NO LOOPHOLES

- JAC subject to the same rules notwithstanding location in GTNP
- Overlapping and interlocking legal requirements
  - Preemption
  - 1990 Noise Act
  - Congressionally Mandated Grant Assurances
- Several communities have tried
  - East Hampton
  - Lantana
  - Naples
  - Burbank



## FLY QUIET PROGRAM GOAL

Encourage pilots to fly quieter aircraft and to utilize procedures that minimize noise over Grand Teton National Park as well as noise sensitive areas of our community.



## FLY QUIET PROGRAM ELEMENTS


ELEMENTS	Goal
Fleet Quality	Acknowledge/encourage operators to fly the quietest aircraft
Minimize Higher Noise Events	Minimize the highest aircraft noise events from individual overflights
Minimize Non- Compliance of Voluntary Curfew	Rated upon number of times an operation occurred during the voluntary curfew hours (9:30pm to 7:00am)
Flight Procedure Compliance	Acknowledge/encourage operators to fly the three noise abatement procedures
BONUSES	Goal
Quiet Fleet Bonus	Acknowledge/encourage operators that operate the very quietest aircraft
Fly New Procedure Bonus	Flying the new arrival procedure

FLY QUIET RATING	FLY QUIET SCORE
FQ Top Tier	90-100+
FQ Compliant	70-89.9
FQ Low Tier	0-69.9

- Scoring System
  - Results based on a 0-100 scoring system
  - Overall best score is sum of the points for all four categories plus bonus points
  - The highest scoring operations are rated as Top Tier and the lowest are rated as Low Tier
- Notifications and Acknowledgements
  - All Fly Quiet Aircraft are scored and grouped in the categories below
- Operations are categorized by type of operator and number of operations



# YEAR-END 2024 FLY QUIET OPERATIONS SUMMARY




Data is from the Airport's Noise Monitoring System and may not exactly match official FAA counts.

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- Shows reduction in number of voluntary curfew hour operations. Continued improvement in flying flight procedure goals. Note Summer compliance lower than winter. Note: interim quarterly results show trends that may be influenced by seasonal conditions or short periods of irregular operations.



#### FLY QUIET PROGRAM TRENDS OVERALL SCORE, FLEET QUALITY & PROCEDURE COMPLIANCE


#### **Overall Fly Quiet Scores**







- Lighting Management Plan will be included in the DarkSky International application






## JAC OPERATIONS 2020-2024
